

45000 books and counting! Meet GAP Star Changemaker Madhavi Sharma, who is igniting a reading revolution among children across India




### Star Changemaker Madhavi Sharma talks about her experience with GAP

Madhavi has been striving to create spaces at the school level where children can have quality time, immersed in books. Till date, Food 4 Thought has collected 45000 books and established 126 libraries. Through her initiative, Madhavi is committed to connecting all the idle, un-used books to hungry young minds, who do not have access to books. Madhavi and her initiative benefitted immensely from the mentoring and network of volunteers provided by GAP. This has helped her in scaling up her organization and creating a clear strategy and budget.

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## The GAP Intensive team was touched and inspired by the work of G Karthikeyan at Sristi Village in Pondicherry, where disabled individuals earn their own livelihood and live with dignity




The GAP Intensive team led by Hari Rao and consisting of Pushpa, David and GAP Agent Anusha visited Sristi Village in Pondicherry to understand the initiative and meet the residents. Sristi Village was founded by G. Karthikeyan, a psychologist born and grown up in Pondicherry. Karthikeyan spent 15 years in an inclusive orphanage where disabled and non-disabled children live and grow up together.

With time, Karthikeyan observed that his intellectually disabled siblings in the orphanage were not accepted and were treated with pity rather than empathy by the outer world. This led him to build an inclusive village where intellectually disabled and marginalized non-disabled individuals can live with dignity and work together.

Sristi Village is a place where everybody is valued and gets an opportunity to live up to his/her potential and lead a holistic life in self-sustainability! The A team observed all the activities like agriculture, dairy farming, and education at the village and are currently working along with Karthikeyan to develop a revenue-generating model for the organization.

# The 'Ideas to Impact' Challenge that GAP hosts with Imperial College London generated 3 winning teams with impactful social ideas



The Gandhi Centre for Inclusive Innovation (GCII) at Imperial College London and GAP jointly hosted the 'Ideas to Impact' Challenge on 23rd March 2018, bringing together UK wide university student teams to present their innovative ideas to solve some of the BIG global challenges we face in society and impact one million people!

Teams pitched their solutions to global challenges within the following themes: financial inclusion, agriculture, education & skills, digital, healthcare & sanitation, and climate, water & energy. The top three winning teams are set to receive start-up funds from the GCII and continuous coaching, mentoring and business support from GAP and its partners to develop their ideas further.

'Mitt Prostheses' won the prize amount of £5000 for their unique, comfortable self-adjustable artificial limb for people with a limb loss. This artificial limb costs significantly less and can be self-fitted. The co-founder **Nathan Macabuag** is excited to make this available to a large number of people without limbs in the world.

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## covering topics from entrepreneurship to leadership which enlightened and empowered many Changemakers





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Changemaker Kalyan Tanksale talks about how GAP helped him restructure his work and evolve a better model



Kalyan Tanksale chose to work for the marginalized sections of society soon after his degree from IIT Bombay. Kalyan is actively helping grassroots communities and development organizations to create models of sustainable development through his organization Pranali Initiatives. In a short span of 5 years, he has touched nearly 5 million lives.

He has been instrumental in enabling governance, transparency, and sustainability of women SHGs. Pranali Initiatives was one of the TOP 50 Innovations identified by the Digital India Challenge of Gol, Intel, and IIM Ahmedabad. In recognition of his contribution towards introducing systems perspective in the school curriculum, he was awarded the Srushti Mitra Award by Government of Maharashtra. Kalyan wants to be a catalyst in enabling sustainable development of 10 million people in 10 years.
